CENTRAL REGION PIPELINE

Atlanta Gas Light is proud to be part of the greater Atlanta community and provide natural gas service on behalf of certified marketers to the thousands of people who call it home. The metropolitan Atlanta region has experienced tremendous growth in the last 15 years and some of that growth has occurred away from our interstate supply points and distribution system. To ensure that those relying on natural gas have it when they need it most on the coldest days of the year, we are improving our natural gas pipeline system under the Georgia Strategic Infrastructure Development and Enhancement Program, or STRIDE, approved by the Georgia Public Service Commission (PSC) in October 2009. Several pipeline installation projects across the metro area are planned through 2012 under the Georgia STRIDE program.

In your community, construction on our Central Region Pipeline is expected to get underway in Fall 2011 and last several months well into 2012. The 16-inch transmission pipeline will run approximately 26 miles through three central Georgia counties. The pipeline construction will begin at McDonough Road in eastern Spalding County and continue through western and northern Butts County and across the eastern tip of Henry County to Highway 81 East. At each endpoint, the pipeline will be connected to existing pipelines. In some areas, it will run cross-country along our easement or adjacent to electric

transmission easements, while in other areas it will parallel and cross highways and secondary roads. Some of the roads along the route include: Highway 16, Highway 42, Bunch Road, Fincherville Road and Highway 81. Two regulator stations will be installed, which allow Atlanta Gas Light to control the volume of gas in the system, in the areas of Highway 42 at Samuel Barber Road and Fincherville Road at Vista Road.

The Central Region Pipeline will contribute to improvements in the overall system, which means communities in Spalding, Butts and Henry counties can be assured of a reliable natural gas system during the coldest days of the year. Also, as with all Georgia STRIDE projects, this pipeline will help contribute to overall economic growth in the region and provide access for families and businesses to the country's most abundant, environmentally friendly fuel.

As with all of our construction projects, safety is our top priority. Great care will be taken in all phases of the project from beginning to end in each neighborhood. We will make every effort to minimize inconveniences to property owners along the route. If you are a customer, we do not expect to disrupt your natural gas service. Atlanta Gas Light will provide ongoing updates to local community groups and elected officials throughout construction.

- Work hours: 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., Monday through Saturday

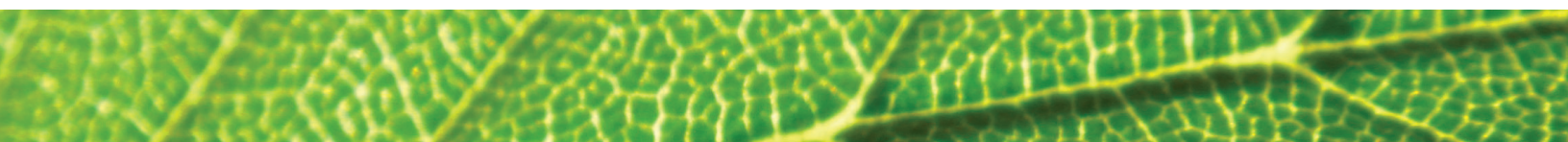

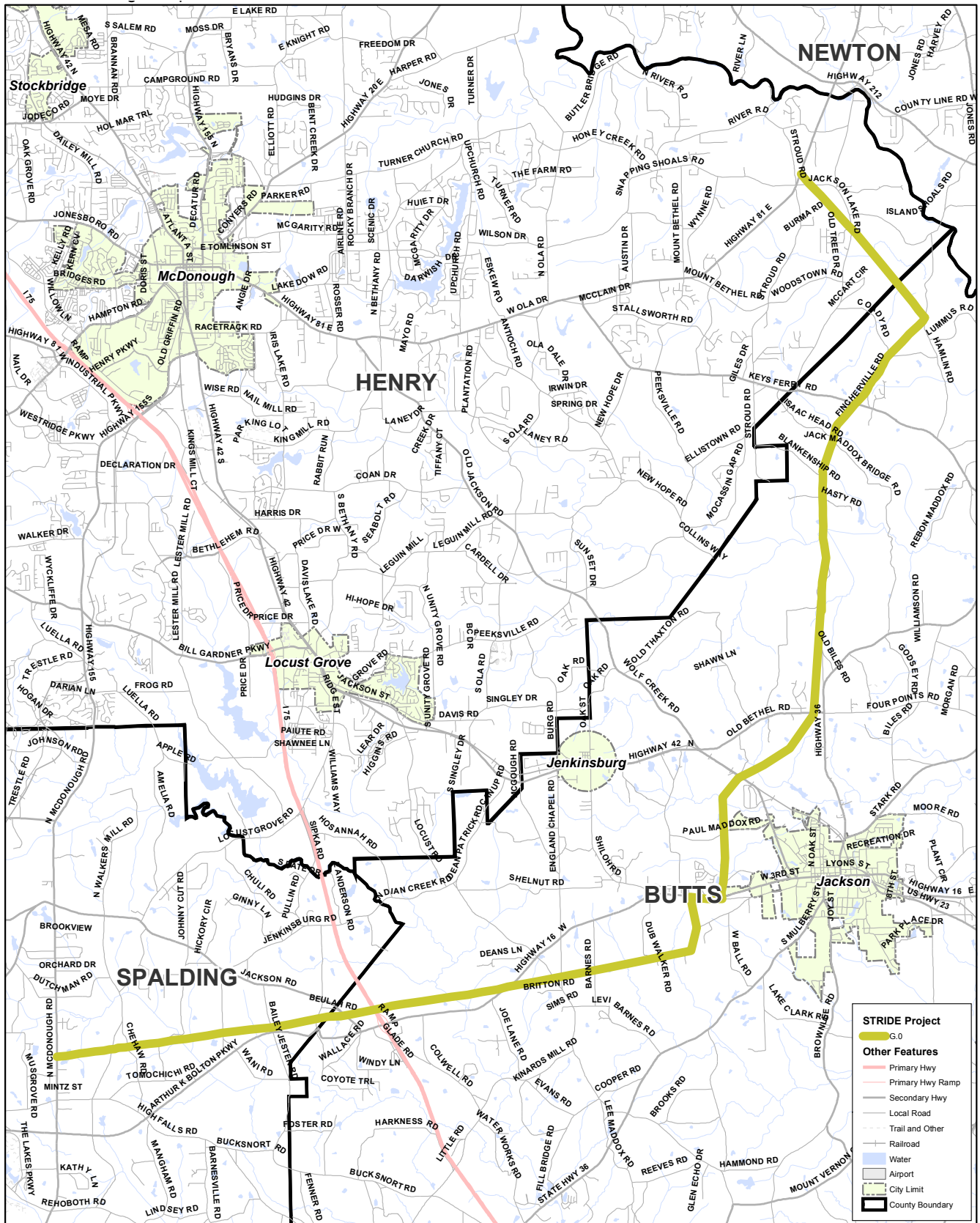
